GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. <u>85-02</u>, 2012

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE K-2 SPICE FUND

The County is prosecuting violations of General Ordinance No. 85-6, 2010.

During the course of such prosecutions, the County is incurring expenses for chemical testing, undercover buys, witness fees, and attorney's fees, which may be assessed as costs by the court against defendants who are guilty of violating the ordinance.

When the court determines that a violation of the ordinance has occurred, it is imposing fines and costs against the defendants.

When a fine and costs are paid, the County is entitled to the fine and some of the costs.

The County wishes to establish a fund to which there will be deposited all monies received from fines and costs to defray the past and future costs of such prosecutions.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. There is now created the Wabash County K-2 Spice Fund into which there shall be deposited all monies received from fines and costs as a result of past and future prosecutions under General Ordinance No. 85-6, 2010.
- 2. Expenditures from the Fund may be used only to defray the past and future expenses incurred in prosecutions under General Ordinance No. 85-6, 2010.
- 3. The fund shall be nonreverting and expenditures therefrom may be made only with the approval of the Board of County Commissioners.
